

THE LORD IS MY SHEPHERD Psalm 23

Good morning Church! This song, one of the most quoted and read Psalms, unique in its genre and structure. David writes 73 of the 150 psalms and he writes this Psalm 23 as a testimony by David to the Lord's faithfulness through his life. As a hymn of confidence, it pictures the Lord as a disciple's Shepherd-Host. David using some ANE images to unveil his personal relationship with the Lord. God's identity as Shepherd brings peace to our reality and clarity to our identity.

A Psalm of David.

"The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. **2** He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. **3** He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. **4** Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. **5** You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. **6** Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever."

Yahweh is described in 4 ways throughout this Psalm:

1. The Lord as Our LEADER. (v 1-2)

- He <u>SHEPHERDS</u> us
- He MAKES me lie down

"If God is having you wait, do what waiters do — serve!"

2. The Lord as Our OWNER. (v 3-4)

- He <u>RESTORES</u> my soul
- He **LEADS** me in the paths of righteousness

"But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.

2 When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you." Isaiah 43:1-2

3. The Lord as Our <u>PROTECTOR</u>. (v 4-5)

4. The Lord as Our <u>PROVIDER</u>. (v 5)

"And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus." **Philippians 4:19**
