Philippines (Oct. 3-12) and Japan (Oct. 12-21)



Summary

<u>Trip Dates</u>: Philippines (Thursday, October, 3rd - Saturday, October 12) and Japan (Saturday afternoon, October 12 - Monday, October 21)

<u>Airfare Plans</u>: Purchase flights by September 1st; Attempt to fly as a Team; some team members may join us only for Japan

<u>Japan (only) Cost</u>: \$2,200 \$2,000 (\$400 hotel) (\$450 hotel) (\$1,000 airfare) (\$1,150 airfare), (\$800 meals + travel)

<u>Philippines + Japan Trip Cost</u>: \$2,900 \$3,300 (\$800 hotel) (\$710 hotel) (\$1,200 airfare) (\$1,725 airfare), (\$900 meals + travel) (\$850 meals + travel)

<u>Ministries in Philippines</u>: 3,000+ppl Youth Event, Medical Clinic, MMA Filipino Team travel, Seminars, Teaching & Feeding in Tanay, Sampaloc, Davao, and Manila (pray for fundraising an extra \$12,000)

<u>Ministries in Japan</u>: Prayer Walking, Attending Church Services, Visiting Sites, Street Evangelism, Gospel Conversation, (pray for fundraising an extra \$3,000) Partnership with Nevertheless Missions, Butch Booth & IMB, Steven Kunkel.

OCSBA Missions and KINGS International Missions, who are a mission-minded martial arts group, are partnering together. This trip is designed to help in cultural learning and cross-cultural evangelism skills. Our team will be exposed to both Christians and non-Christians alike in the Philippines and Japan, learn more about intercultural teaming, and how to build bridges for the Gospel. Our goal is to mobilize and develop a missionary heart in OC Churches by sending people to short-term missions who partner with Christian international churches, ministry leaders and missionaries to reach the lost with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Outcomes

- Observe and experience other cultures and peoples.
- Learn how to build cross-cultural relationships.
- Engage in cross-cultural evangelism and build Gospel bridges with different faith backgrounds.
- Learn about Filipino Catholicism and Islam; then Buddhism, Shintoism, and other religious practices of the Japanese people.
- Observe and dialogue with independent missionaries and IMB field personnel to explore international missionary life
- Work with Filipino and Japanese Christian partners.

Team Values

- Participate with a grateful heart, a good attitude, a flexible mindset for the 2-week-long mission trip.
- (See Team Covenant page) Each Team Member are expected to show respect for everyone involved in this experience, including team members, missionaries, and local partners regardless of differences in strengths, values, and cultural perspectives. Each person is expected to participate in travel, training, and sharing their own strengths while affirming other members of the team to do the same. Cooperation and following instructions are key to making this a successful team experience.

Trip Practicalities

- Call your bank about partnered banks in the Philippines and/or Japan to use DEBIT CARD/CREDIT CARD.
- Money Exchange carry Pesos/Yin and exchange at the airport or somewhere else
- **Bring Cash** of about \$400-\$500
- SD Cards + Pocket Wifi are optional for purchase; What's App, Messenger is another source to communicate.
- Team will stay together for the duration of the trip including our Free Days (this is not vacation)
- Use your First and Last Name in conversations, they will give you a title
- Share the tab when eating together with national partners
- **Deflect and be humble** when given compliments (praise God for it); high-context/low-context culture means to read between the lines...
- **Dress modestly** (5 polos, 1 pair of jeans, 2 pair of khaki pants, long sleeve, slacks, hoodie, underwear, nice socks, 2 pair of shorts & t-shirts)
- Wear practical walking shoes (shower shoes, 2 pair of walking shoes)
- Take shoes off in homes
- Pack small trash bags for Japan or be prepared to keep trash until you get back to hotel (there are no trashcans on the streets)
- Prepare for rain/cooler weather (Hoodie, jacket, poncho, and umbrella)
- Adaptor/converter (may not be necessary)
- Medication/emergency contact information (please fill out Health Form)
- Pockets tissue, mints, cough drops, etc.
- Bible to use for personal and when we visit churches
- Small Gifts (American Candy & Chocolates are always a win!)
- Escalators: In Tokyo, stay on the left; in Osaka, stay on the right
- Riding Public Transportation: keep conversations low & to a minimum (no talking on phones)
- **Eating To Go**: make sure not to eat anything on public transit or while walking down the street in Japan

Team Preparation

- **Pray** Pray for local work, team members, logistical issues to come together, relationships God has prepared for us and with others.
- Read God's Word For example: Acts 17:16-34
 - How did Paul learn about the city of Athens and their values?
 - What was Paul's response to the idolatry of the people?
 - What was the response of Epicuren and Stoic philosophers in v. 19?
 - What did Paul do to make them respond in this way?
 - How did Paul resent the Gospel?
- Write Your Testimony Team members are required to write out and practice your personal salvation testimony before going on the trip. We will have opportunities to share your testimony multiple times with other people throughout the trip. Please use the "Spiritual Preparation Sheet" (pg. 5-6) that provides adequate scriptures to share the gospel.
- <u>Learn Gospel Presentations</u> Learning a few gospel presentations to share is very helpful for intercultural evangelism as visuals help bridge communication when words seem to be more difficult. Team Members are required to learn how to use the Four Spiritual Laws, the 3-Circles, the Bridge, New Life L6 The Gospel, or Roman Road presentations to share with other people.
- (Optional) Journaling Reflect as you begin to pray for yourself, the team, and people consistently before the trip. Share daily notes and reflections during the 8 days in each country, plus, a personal reflection and highlights, lessons learned, and what we saw God do during the trip. This will not only keep you focused on the trip, but it will help you prepare to share with others when you return.
- (Optional) Book Reflections and Videos Read the book Dougill, John. In Search of Japan's Hidden Christians: A Story of Suppression, Secrecy and Survival. Clarendon, VT: Tuttle Publishing. 2012, Lee, Samuel. The Japanese and Christianity: Why Is Christianity Not Widely Believed in Japan? Amsterdam: Foundation University Press, 2014, and Terry, Mark. Missiology: An Introduction. Nashville: B&H Publishing, 2015
- <u>Build A Support Team</u> Write a Support Letter and include as many people as possible to pray, give, & support you and our Mission Team.
- <u>Participate in Team Meetings</u> September 6th & 22nd, there will be two Team Meetings for prayer, logistics, and training to go in October. Please make sure your passports are updated.

Personal Spiritual Preparation Sheet

This is essential to your usefulness. It is very difficult to be useful with unconfessed sin in our life (*Proverbs 28:13, 1 John 1:8-9*). Jesus called the disciples to first be with Him — then preach and minister (*Mark 3:14-15*). Jesus also calls us to first be in Him and He is in us if we are to be fruitful. (*John 15:5*).

- 1. Ernest Prayer is the most important necessity of individual (and team) preparation. Start praying daily as soon as you learn of the possibility of your helping on a mission trip, and don't stop praying!
- 2. Personal devotional Bible Study is essential to "abiding in Jesus" which is essential to being useful. Listed are just a few good recommended examples of Scriptures helpful for your personal daily Bible Study:
- 3. John 3:16-18 tells us WHY to do a Mission Trip.
- 4. The following verses tell us <u>WHO</u> the Message is Jesus Christ: (Acts 1:8, John 14:6, Acts 17:2-3, Acts 4:10-12)
- 5. The following verses tell us HOW to prepare: Confess our sins (1 John 1:8-9, 1 Thessalonians 5:17 & John 14:13) and pray until we have no will of our own (Philippians 3:10, John 15:5, Mark 3:14-15 & Acts 4:13) Our call is to first be with Jesus (Matthew 5:10-12)
- 6. Matthew 28:18-20 tells us WHAT THE GOAL is.
- 7. Ephesians 6:10-18 tells us WHO THE ENEMY is (Keep your spiritual guard up).
- 8. Personal Bible preparation is essential to being a well-equipped and useful worker (2 Timothy 2:15; 2 Timothy 3:15-17) Have marked in your Bible and know by memory some salvation scriptures.

Good examples for your TESTIMONY are:

John 3:16-18, Romans 3:23, Romans 5:8, Romans 6:23, John 14:6, Ephesians 2:8-9, Romans 10:9-10, Romans 10:13, John 1:12, Acts 3:19.

Also, mark in your Bible some good discipleship scriptures such as:

Proverbs 28:13, 1 John 1:8-9, 2 Corinthians 5:15 & 17, John 10:27-29, Romans 8:38-39, 2 Timothy 2:15, 1 Thessalonians 5:17, John 14:13-15, Acts 1:8, Matthew 28:18-20, Philippians 4:13, Philippians 3:10, Galatians 5:22, Hebrews 10:25, John 15:5, etc.

MY PERSONAL TESTIMONY WORKSHEET

To further ensure a successful trip that will (1) maintain a God-honoring standard for the team and OCSBA, (2) portray a proper testimony to all people impacted by the team, and (3) have a vital impact on each team member and your sending church, we have established the following guidelines:

- Exhibit a servant attitude.
- Pray for other team members and others participating on the mission trip(s).
- Participate fully in all team preparation and evaluation activities.
- Practice punctuality.
- Offer grace to my fellow team members, especially to the team leader(s).
- Be flexible and fluid in every circumstance (hot, cold, rain, travel, delays, lay-overs, etc.)
- Fully submit to team leadership and the guidance of on-site nationals.
- Be a team player, encourager, and supporter.
- Accomplish whatever tasks assigned whether on the project site(s), at housing and accommodations, or while traveling as "unto the Lord."
- Be willing to abstain from conduct, as requested by team leaders, which
 might be offensive to others or may be contrary to a clear testimony for
 Jesus Christ, realizing that customs vary greatly from culture to culture. In
 particular, team members are asked to refrain from all use of tobacco,
 alcoholic beverages (this includes wine and beer), or abusive drugs.
